At the end of last month, we celebrated the Feast of Thanksgiving. The Feast of Thanksgiving gives us an opportunity to look back at “all the blessings in this life” (BCP, p. 101) and to give thanks. At St. Philip, we have a “horn of plenty” that is filled with many faithful and cheerful people that serve our church. Our blessings are to be counted in faithful leadership, faithful worship, sound teaching, compassionate pastoral care and our love for each other.

Blessings can be found in the many ministries, programs and activities at St. Philip that are led by lay leadership giving themselves to service and generous giving. We are blessed with a beautiful campus and worship space and with a measure of financial stability. The Feast of Thanksgiving also serves as a “hinge” holiday between the closing of the previous liturgical year and the beginning of a new liturgical year that is marked by the First Sunday of Advent.

It is fitting that we begin the new Christian Year with Advent as we turn our focus on the Incarnation first found in Bethlehem. The Advent season is structured to prepare ourselves through prayer, self-evaluation, instruction, watchfulness and in a “holy waiting”. In Advent, we recall in joyful hope and wait as we anticipate the coming of the Christ-child and look forward to his Second Coming. Waiting is an essential part of our Christian life and journey together. This waiting is not an empty waiting like in the Samuel Beckett play: “Waiting for Godot”. Our waiting is a waiting with a promise.

As Christians, we are always waiting. The Christian journey is all about waiting. We wait during Lent for the celebration of Easter. We wait for the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. In Advent, we wait for the birth of the Christ-child and we wait for Christ as he returns in glory in the Second Coming. To anticipate the Incarnation of Christ in Advent is also to anticipate the Second coming of Christ where all of Creation will become complete at the “End Time”, the final Advent!

In this season of Advent, may we wait, watch, worship and love to prepare ourselves in the “joyful hope” for the coming of the Christ-Child that will be King! Have a joyful Advent and a Merry Christmas!








Inclement Weather Policy
