

Oktober Feasting at St. Philip

Whew! Mid and upper nineties in October? I love warmer weather but many of us are ready for more of a feeling of fall with some cooler weather. The forecast is supposed to change but . . . We'll see. Going with our fall schedule, we had our annual "Rally Day" after Labor Day to kick off our return, in earnest, to our parish life and schedules.

In our Christian Education and Formation this fall, the Women's Bible Study on Tuesdays are studying Romans while the Adult Education class on Sunday mornings is studying the journey and significance of Simon Peter through a very interesting study guided by Adam Hamilton's video/book series, *Simon Peter*. The faithful ladies of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd have returned to their post holding classes for our young people to provide for them a firm foundation of our faith and worship.

We continue our festive fall in October by an "October-feast" of other special events. We will celebrate St. Francis Feast Day by having our annual Blessing of the Animals which is popular with owners and pets alike (no scorpions please!). In mid-month, we will celebrate our annual St. Philip Feast Day by offering special liturgies and some very special food delights at noon on that Sunday. Toward the end of the month, back by popular demand, we will be having our now famous St. Philip Shrimp Boil for our parish, friends and community.

During these festive times, let us not forget that we also continue in that sacred and liturgical time of the Pentecost Season— Ordinary Time. We are reminded from a recent celebration of St. Matthew Feast Day in our Healing Service and in our ongoing study of Simon Peter that God calls lowly and ordinary people to do great things for the Kingdom of God. There is a long history of people responding to God's call by saying "What? Little ole' me?" God doesn't buy it because He knows that through His will and the Holy Spirit that ordinary people can do extraordinary things for the Kingdom of God. Our Lord knows that at the very least ordinary people can make an extraordinary differences in the life of another. We are all called to look for and find opportunities to make a difference in the lives of others by sharing the love of God and by being an example of God's love. Yes, "little ole' us", ordinary people, attempting to make an extraordinary difference in . . . Ordinary Time. *May it be so with us.*

The Bees Are Buzzing at St. Philip!

The “Thistle and Bee” ministry is a social enterprise created to help women thrive who have survived prostitution, trafficking and abuse. The local “Thistle and Bee” ministry is raising bees to make products that include honey, granola, hand-crafted teas and other developing products. In good stewardship of our land and location, St. Philip has agreed to be a bee hive site for this ministry. We will be able to purchase products from our site to continue to support this wonderful ministry.



Update:

The Thistle and Bee Ministry at St. Philip has been pretty “bee-sy” lately. This summer there was a city-wide harvest and processing project held in our PLC where the honey was filtered and put in large buckets for further bottling and usage. It was quite a production! A special thanks to Katie Swalley for her hard work as a team member for this two-day project.

After the harvest, an unproductive bee hive was removed, but later two more “visiting” bee hives were installed due to a recent displacement. The Thistle and Bee coordinators are carefully monitoring their progress.

New Columbarium in Our St. Philip Cemetery


St. Philip recently entered into an agreement with Nu-Way Funeral and Cremation Services. Through this agreement Nu-Way has provided, at no cost to St. Philip, a 24-niche Columbarium for our church cemetery. Nu-Way will be the manager of the columbarium and handle all sales of the niches. For this service and the permanent placement of the columbarium, Nu-Way will receive a management fee from each sale and St. Philip will also receive a percentage of each sale. The columbarium is in place and there will be additional landscaping done this fall as COOLER temps return.

For this service Nu-Way requests that purchasers of niches review the crematory and funeral services provided by Nu-Way. This is not a requirement for a purchase.
